Welcome to Camp Meeting 2013. Our theme, "Walk with HIM," should reflect our daily journey toward the Kingdom.

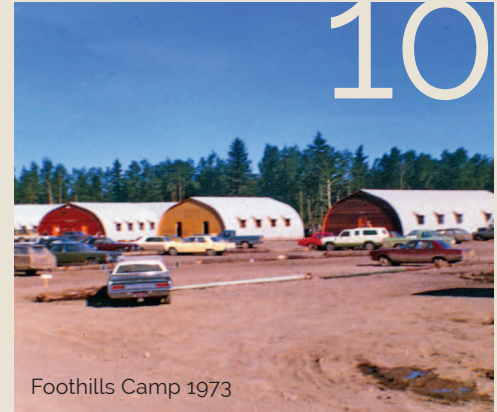
Camp meeting and Adventism almost seem synonymous. The first camp meeting in Canada was in 1886 in Quebec, but the first one in Western Canada was in 1897 near Winnipeg. In Alberta, the first camp meeting was held in 1904 at Ponoka, but moved from place to place until 1925 when it came to rest at CUC. Foothills Camp opened in 1973, marking this the 40th year.

Camp meetings actually started among the Presbyterians in Kentucky in the early 1800's, then flourished among the Methodists, and continued with Seventh-day Adventists who held their first one in 1868.

These early camp meetings were primarily evangelistic in nature. Thousands of people attended, accepted Jesus as Savior and were baptized. Free from distraction of routine employment or daily livelihood, these events provided excellent opportunity for the Holy Spirit to bring conviction to the heart.

Although the focus today may have shifted, the end result still is to show people how to "Walk with HIM." As we prepare for this special convocation pray for an enriching spiritual growth experience that will draw us closer to our Lord and Savior.

40 YEAR CELEBRATION Foothills Camp

Camp meeting has been an Adventist tradition in Alberta since 1904 when 50 people attended the first camp meeting in Ponoka. For 70 years after, Adventists met in various places throughout the province. As attendance grew, it became clear that a new location was necessary. So the search began for a location that would provide permanent facilities for

a conference-wide camp meeting site. About the same time, the Alberta Conference was developing a new youth camp site 24 kms west of Bowden, and in 1972, the Alberta Conference Committee voted to "look with favour at developing camp meeting facilities for 1973 in conjunction with the new youth camp site northwest of Olds."

Once the decision was made to use the camp site as a permanent camp meeting location, the hard work of building began and the following facilities were completed:



Foothills Camp 1973

- Camping and trailer sites with picnic tables nearby.

- A lodge of cedar-log construction with sleeping accommodations for 140 people, dining facilities on the main floor and two worship rooms with fireplaces.

- Four sleeping units and two dormitories were erected with over 60 heated rooms.

- Two large washrooms to accommodate those not staying in the lodge.

- Four quonset-style auditoriums with plans to winterize and heat one of the auditoriums for year-round use.

Although the buildings were completed, the camp grounds still needed some finishing touches, so in May, 1973, over one hundred volunteers arrived to cut logs, pile wood, and burn brush. While the ladies worked inside the lodge washing windows and sanding walls for the final finishing coat of sealer, the men and boys worked with plumbing, heating, and levelling of floors of various buildings prior to pouring cement. The Anderson brothers showed up with their heavy equipment to help with the landscaping. The archives report that "the weather was glorious, and a profitable time was enjoyed by all."

In July, 1973, with the theme "'But by My SPIRIT,' saith the Lord," Foothills Camp was ready for camp meeting. Innisfail MLA Cliff Dean represented the Province of Alberta at the official ribbon-cutting, and residents

living in the area were invited to attend the opening ceremonies followed by a luncheon. They were also invited to attend the meetings throughout the week. The speakers included General Conference Ministerial Secretary E.E. Cleveland, and General Conference Associate Secretaries Ben J. Liebelt and Lowell L. Bock. Special musicians included The Heritage Family, Russell Davis, singer for Concerts for Christ, and the King's Heralds of the Voice of Prophecy.

Other camp meeting participants included: R.C. Naden, Field Secretary for the Australasian Division; Chuck Scriven, Insight Magazine; A. Mazat, Signs of the Times magazine; T.E. Unruh, former Education & MV Secretary; Dr. Gus Hoehn, dermatologist; Josephine Cunnington Edwards, a favourite story teller; W.M. Adams, Religious

Liberty; and H.M.S. Richards of the Voice of Prophecy. Local and Canadian Union leaders were also represented.

Unfortunately the "glorious weather" that the volunteers had enjoyed in May disappeared, and rain poured down on the camp just prior to the grand opening.

"The fresh landscaping and unpacked roadways became 'miry ways.' Sabbath turned out to be a sunny day but the mud remained. There was no place to park; vehicles got stuck and boots and shoes tracked every building. On Sabbath Pastor John Anderson donned a pair of boots and work clothes, started up the bobcat and pulled vehicles out of the mud and spread some gravel. Looking back, people still recall camp meeting of 1973 for the weather more than the spiritual blessings."



It's an opportunity to see old friends and meet new ones, to spend time with family, and to take time for spiritual growth.

The rain was so memorable, in fact, that when Alberta Conference President Kaytor accepted a call to be president of the British Columbia Conference, he was given a pair of rubber boots as a gift. The sentiment was, "After all, we are concerned as to how you fare in the monsoon regions of B.C."

In the 40 years that Foothills Camp has been home to camp meetings in Alberta, Adventists have seen many storms during July camp meetings, but in spite of that, the camp meeting tradition continues. It's an opportunity to see old friends and meet new ones, to spend time with family, and to take time for spiritual growth.

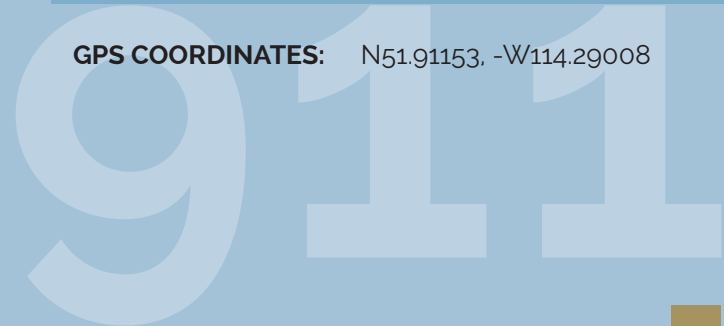

The following guidelines are in place for the comfort and safety of all users of Foothills Camp. Your cooperation in observing them is very much appreciated.

1. Quiet time is 11:00 p.m.
2. Children under 18 years of age are not permitted to stay overnight at the campground unless under adult supervision of an immediate family member.
3. Pets are not permitted on the campground during camp meeting. If you bring your pet, you will be asked to move to a designated non-serviced site. If you are unwilling to comply with the pet policy, your accommodation will be assigned to another guest next year. Thank you in advance for your cooperation. Please see the list of nearby kennels:

4. Bicycles, skateboards, water guns and firearms are not permitted on the campground.
5. Campers in the 15 amp sites are prohibited from using air conditioners or other major electrical appliances due to inadequate electrical power.
6. The maximum occupancy on any camping site is one camping unit plus one same-family tent.
7. A maximum of two vehicles are permitted at one RV site, campsite, or cabin.
8. Camping is ONLY permitted in assigned areas.
9. No open fires are permitted on the campground, either indoors or outdoors. This includes candles, citronella pails, torches, or open flame of any kind.
10. A \$10 per key CASH deposit will be required at registration for all cabins, lodge rooms, and division buildings. The deposit will be refunded when you return the key(s) upon departure.
11. The cafeteria will provide all meals, including Sabbaths, with the exception of the Sunday lunch, which is the International Food Fair. Meal tickets are only available at the Camp Administration Office. No meal tickets will be sold during Sabbath hours. Unused meal tickets will be refunded if turned in before 11:00 a.m. Sunday, July 21, 2013.
12. 2014 REGISTRATION: If you wish to register for the same camping site you have this year and you still meet size specifications for that site, you must fill out a registration form at the camp office BEFORE TUESDAY, JULY 16, 2013.

- Beginning WEDNESDAY, July 17 at 9:00 a.m., you may turn in a request for a site change for 2014. No promise will be made to you, but we will try to honour your request if possible. You will be notified at a later date.
13. Please do not wash your vehicle or RV while on the campgrounds. Water supplies are limited.
 14. Parents, please ensure that your children have adequate skin protection for all outdoor activities. Wearing a T-shirt is recommended for water-ski outings to guard against serious sunburn.
 15. Solicitation, merchandise sales, and distribution of literature by unauthorized persons is not permitted on the campgrounds. If you wish to promote personal and private CDs, etc., you must obtain pre-approval from Larry Wilton at the Adventist Book Center.
 16. Lifestyle in the Seventh-day Adventist Church promotes the non-use of tobacco, alcohol or illicit drugs. Use of these in any form is not permitted.
 17. Parking in driveways is not permitted. Avoid double-parking and blocking others. Infractions may necessitate your car being towed away.
 18. Small appliances such as kettles, rice cookers, and microwaves are not permitted to be used in the Lodge rooms.
 19. Scent Free - Please be mindful of those who struggle with allergy issues. Avoid wearing strong scented perfumes and lotions.
 20. Prevent fires and notify security personnel immediately of any fire or perceived fire risks.



Please note: In the event of any of the following emergency situations, the camp Fire Marshal and security will be on hand to assist you in following these procedures.

Tornado

In case of tornado **warning**, evacuate the campground in an orderly fashion. Make sure you have all your family members accounted for. DO NOT hook up your trailer or pack. Get in your vehicle and leave in the designated direction away from the oncoming tornado.

If a tornado is **imminent** (no time to evacuate) do the following:

1. Be alert to stay away from the vicinity of power lines.
2. Stay out of cars.
3. Lie flat on the ground in a low area.
4. The disabled and the elderly need to go in the basement of the Lodge.

Fire

In case of fire in a building, walk quietly but quickly to the nearest exit and proceed to a safe distance from the building.

1. DO NOT panic. DO NOT rush, push, or overtake.
2. Follow instructions of the Fire Marshal and security.
3. Keep noise to a minimum so that all instructions may be easily heard.
4. DO NOT return to the building until all clear is given by the Fire Marshal.
5. Call 911.

Severe lighting storm

- Stay away from water, metal objects, all electrical devices, telephones, vehicles, and other substances that will conduct electricity.

- All campers are to take shelter in a safe place.
- Avoid standing under high objects.
- Alert staff to possible fire or other emergencies.
- Unplug all electronics.

Severe storms

1. Proceed to shelters (main building, Lodge, bathrooms).
2. Cabin residents, stay in your cabin.
3. If sufficient notice, retract all awnings, tie downs and put any loose objects inside your RVs.

LOOK for weather updates on main bulletin board or listen to the camp radio station at 106.3 FM.

The commission to "Go and make disciples of all nations..." has been and still is the focus of the Alberta Conference. We have seen growth spiritually and numerically as members and pastors together combine their efforts in reaching communities.

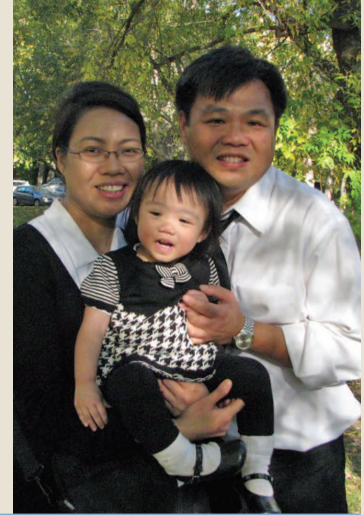
Wallin O'Connor

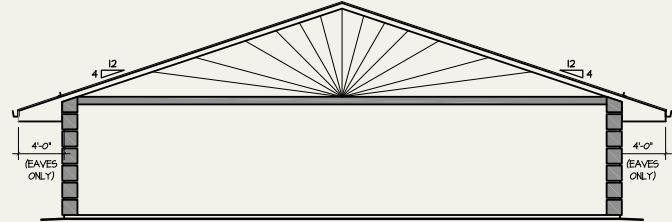
Proposed Camp Washrooms



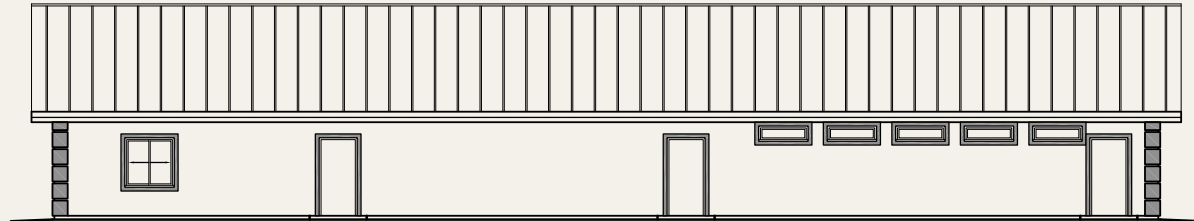
Building Elevation

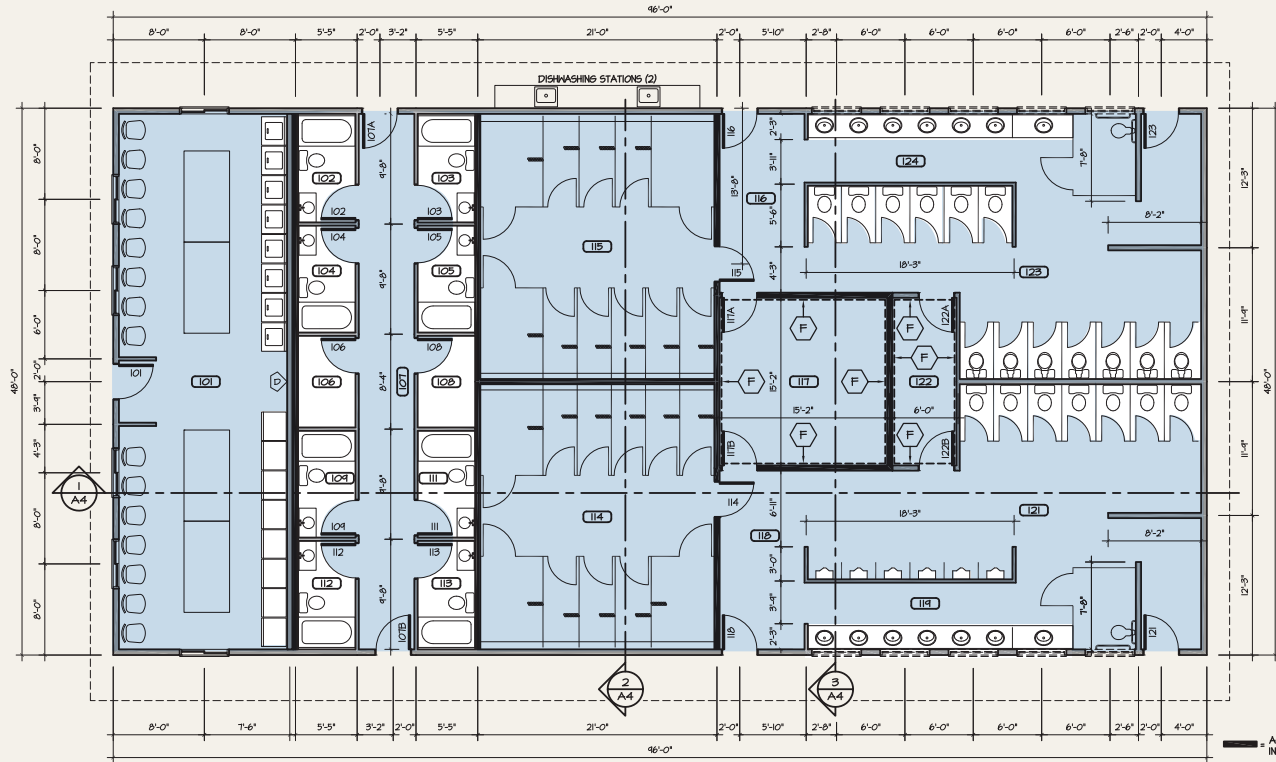

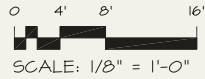

Will Organization Checklist

Things you should put in a Will:

- An Executor (who will administer your estate, take care of business details)
- An Alternate Executor (in case the Executor can't or won't act in that capacity)
- Guardian for your children under age 18
- Consider all classes of Beneficiaries to be included (ex.: children, a specific charity)*
- How much each individual, club, charity, etc. is to receive (percentage or fraction terms are best)
- Distribution of chattels where direct conveyance is important (ex: mineral rights)
- Alternate Beneficiary(s), who benefit if someone in the first group of Beneficiaries is not alive
- If responsible for adult or minor children, a trust or other provision for maintenance

Things better put in a letter stored with the Will:

- Individuals that you would like to see get specific personal effects
- Funeral and burial preferences, service order and participants, grave plot location
- List of assets and their location (ex.: RRSPs, shares, bank accounts, life insurance, mineral rights, valuable collections, etc.)
- Contact information for your accountant

Besides offsetting taxes, including God's Church in your Will allows you to proclaim that for you, God is always part of the equation.

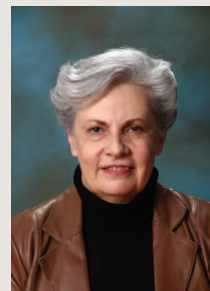
