Keeping in Touch

to move recently, I came across a collection of old family letters. I stopped packing for a few minutes to read some of them. I have never met the people who were writing. They died before I was born.



But those letters were important. They spoke of work, travels and everyday life. They were a way of staying connected with people who were family.

We don't send a lot of letters nowadays. Mostly, we call each other or send emails. But staying

in touch with family and friends is just as important to us and perhaps even more so it was for those letter writers so long ago.

When I look at the Bible, I find a collection of letters, written by God's leaders as they kept in touch with the church. I am glad that we have those letters in our homes today, because through them Christ has taught us how to live and what is truth. We need to read and re-read them frequently as we travel toward the Kingdom.

Here in Alberta, our church family stays in touch through *Alberta Adventist News*. This publication shares stories and inspiration within the Adventist family. Four times a year it has been printed and then mailed to our churches for local distribution. That process does not permit us to share inspiration and ideas as quickly as many of us would wish.

To share news and ideas more effectively through our Alberta Adventist family, we are planning some changes. We want to share the news when it is news, provide stories of faith and God's triumph, and exchange ideas for witness and ministry and all the other features you've come to appreciate in Alberta Adventist News. We want to do it more often and with greater speed. Beginning with our next issue, Alberta Adventist News will be distributed through the Internet as a PDF document. We will email it to a contact person for each congregation, which they in turn may email to every family in the local church. We will still produce a very limited number of print copies that will be sent to local churches. Some in the local church may wish to print additional copies from their computer for friends and family who are not connected to the Internet. Also, each issue will be posted on the Alberta Conference website (www.albertasda.org). It is important to us all that no one be placed out of the loop.

We will begin by publishing the newsletter every other month. As we get better at it, we'd like to do it more often, and I think we can.

We want to feature news, ideas, and experiences that will help us to make our churches and schools all that Christ wants them to be — places where we welcome new friends and encourage each other as we wait for Jesus to return.

I'm anxious to see Jesus. In all the turmoil currently surrounding us, it is wonderful to remember that the Bank of Heaven will never fail. No one will lose his or her life savings. There will be no hospitals with dying friends. Jesus will make everything right. And so I echo the words of John who, missing Jesus, said "Even so. come, Lord Jesus" *Revelation* 22:20.






