### YOUR CONFERENCE

n Sunday, September 28, 2008, delegates from Seventh-day Adventist churches in Alberta met in the gymnasium of College Heights Christian School for the 49th Session of the Alberta Conference of the Seventh-day Adventist Church. This was a regular business meeting during which time administrative and departmental reports were received, administrative officers elected, an executive committee elected, and bylaw changes duly considered. The chosen delegates from each church essentially transacted important business of the formally organized Seventh-day Adventist Church in Alberta.

For many members of Seventh-day Adventist churches, "the Conference" is a little known entity. For some, it is just an office located at Red Deer, Alberta, where the staff just sits around with little to do. But, for those who are in that office it really is a "bee hive" of activity. Administrators are responsible for \$24,000,000 worth of assets; ensure payroll services for 50+ pastors, 60+ teachers and teacher aides, 21 office and Foothills Camp staff, summer camp staff, and "courtesy payroll" employees; plan camp meetings, pastors' meetings, teachers' conventions; and most importantly, encourage and support evangelism activities. The recruitment and placement of pastors and teachers is an ongoing process where a strong commitment to Christian Seventh-day Adventist fundamental beliefs and a close relationship with God is mandatory in the selection process. The staff in the Treasury Department processes \$14,000,000 tithe and other income funds annually. The Education Department coordinates nine day schools, and offers home schooling and on-line learning for those unable to attend a church school. The Youth Department, in addition to working with youth leaders in the various churches and planning youth rallies, offers various summer camps to as many as 400 campers a summer. The Sabbath School and Personal Ministries Department provides resources to local churches and encourages the role of the Sabbath school in ne church and the role of the individual church member in sharing the gospel message, a necessity in ensuring

that we follow the great commission Jesus gave to His disciples long ago. I would like to encourage each church member to find a time to drop by the conference office, take a tour of the departments, and see for yourself what is going on in your conference office.

During the session, an executive committee was elected which acts as a board of directors in giving direction to management, ensuring the integrity of financial activities, and to whom the President, the Vice President for Administration, and the Vice President for Finance report at regularly-called executive committee meetings. During my term of office, the Executive Committee was comprised of 18 members of whom 11 were lay persons. The Executive Committee has been instrumental in establishing the vision for the Seventh-day Adventist Church in Alberta, "Every Member Faithful," and making decisions supporting the mission statement, "To proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ through serving, teaching, and preaching." Many a Sunday has been spent by your executive committee members, during the past four years, in transacting the business of your conference.

This is my last editorial message to you as your conference president. I am retiring following this session. My wife, Judy, and I will be making our home in the Wetaskiwin area. (Yes, we like living here in Alberta!) We have enjoyed almost five years working in the Alberta Conference as your president. God has been good to us. We have had a great office staff with which to work. We have had a great pastoral team. We have had dedicated and hard working teachers. We have had a committed executive committee. But, best of all, we have had very strong support from the membership of our churches throughout this great conference. This has been demonstrated in church growth, annual increase in tithe and offerings, and was most recently demonstrated in the evangelism offering at this summer's Foothills Camp Meeting which exceeded \$200,000. Thank you to every one in this conference for your prayerful support of the

# 49th Constituency Session Report

### September 28, 2008

on another beautiful, warm, sunny, fall day in Central Alberta, delegates came together at 9:30 a.m. to do the business of our Conference, hear reports of the past quadriennial period, and make plans for the next four-year period. However, the members of the Organizing Committee began their work at 7:30 a.m. that day.

Elder Dan Jackson, assisted by Corrine Vanderwerff (secretary of the Nominating Committee), presented the recommendations of the Nominating Committee with respect to the administrative leadership of the Alberta Conference of the Seventh-day Adventist Church for the ensuing quadrennial period 2008-2012. After a PowerPoint presentation about the president-elect, the delegates and delegates-at-large voted unanimously to elect Pastor Mark Johnson to be our conference president for the ensuing quadrennial term. They also voted to reelect incumbent officers Pastor Romulo Daquila as Vice President for

Administration and Robert Holdal as Vice President for Finance. Pastor Johnson put on his "presidential" hat October 1, 2008, and will take up residence in Alberta sometime later in October.

Recommendations also came forward from the Nominating Committee for a new Executive and Act & Bylaws Committee. The Organizing Committee also presented their recommendations for a new Norminating Committee for the ensuing quadrennial (see p. 4 for complete lists of new committees appointed).

Just prior to breaking for lunch that day, a surprise farewell / retirement cake was presented to Elder and Mrs.

William Olson in acknowledgement of their upcoming retirement. The cake was shared with the delegates at the CUC Cafeteria as dessert with the meal.

In other business, the constituents voted to accept the Financial Report as presented by Robert Holdal, VP for Finance.

A very significant item on the agenda was the "Office Location Proposal." By a PowerPoint presentation, the treasurer showed and explained the recent water problems encountered in our present conference office building and what some of the challenges faced to repair a seemingly impossible situation. A parcel of land near Lacombe on the QEII was presented as a possible location for a new building. The estimated costs were given on the two options. After some discussion on the ramifications of solving the water dilemma versus a new location, the delegates:

VOTED to approve the relocation of the Conference office building from Red Deer subject to the presentation of realistic costs to the Executive Committee.

As the day wore on, it was then time for Ora-Lee Phillips, representing the Act and Bylaws Committee, to present the recommended changes to the delegates. After some deliberation on the technicalities of "the law," the recommended changes were finally brought to a vote. And all was well!

The last item on the agenda was the acceptance of the newly organized churches in the Alberta Conference since the last session in 2004, which are as follows:


# Calgary Mountain View
