Don't Play It Safe

Take Risks

et out of the rut! Do things differently! Be bold! The New Testament says that Peter and his friends turned the world upside down. Some thought they were drunk. That reputation didn't come from wearing both suspenders and a belt–they took risks.

There always will be plenty of people telling you why something can't be done. There always will be people telling you to play it safe. But I say, "Go for it!"

What about planting a new church in your town? Some will say, "It can't be done!" But why not ask God if He would like to have it done? Maybe He is looking to increase His market share over the devil and would like to do it with another church in your city.

You have never conducted an evangelistic meeting? Well, you can't start any younger! Do it in your church or at a local motel or in your own home. Hundreds of young people have run hundreds of Revelation seminars. That worked too, and hundreds of people have been baptized as a result. Those young people didn't have enough experience to know that it couldn't be done. They followed the simple directions outlined in the director's kit, and God blessed.

You've never been outside the [country]? Why not join a Maranatha trip and help build a new church in the Dominican Republic, for instance? Link up with fellow church members or get community members to join you. Now...how do you know they won't go? Several friends of Adventists have already gone. Some non-Seventh-day Adventist Christians have been thrilled to have a part in building a church.

Let's press ourselves to go beyond our usual boundaries. Let's ask more people to accept Jesus. I too have been afraid of offending people, so at times I've not witnessed as openly as I wish I had. It's time to take greater risks. The chances of offending someone with our witness is not as great a possibility as being too quiet in our witness. When I think about how many people I've offended by asking them to accept Jesus, I realize that the list is not nearly as long as the list of those I've never asked at all.

One pastor I know regularly asks people, "What would it take for you to accept Jesus? No one gets mad. Nobody dies of a heart attack. This pastor leads more people to Jesus than almost anyone I know. I want to be more bold too.

Time is short. Radio and TV move from one commercial to another in 15 or 30 seconds. A long commercial is one minute. And a really long infomercial is a half hour. Subjects change often. Why do I think I must wait for just the right time to say something for Jesus?

I think I'll take more risks for God, attempt bigger things for Him. My new prayer will be "Lord, forgive me for my timid ways, my small plans, my fears. Cover my mistakes in the future, and help me to be fearless for You. Let me do more for You. Help me to do even things that I've never done before. And help me to mean it when I say to You, 'You are looking for someone? Well, here I am. You can send me!"

Mamawi Atosketan Native School Project

he Offer to Purchase land for the Mamawi Atosketan Native School Constituency Building Project was signed on Wednesday, January 2, 2002, with a possession date of January 21, 2002. The Building Committee met in January to proceed with building plans for this spring, 2002.

With these developments, it is time to complete the fund raising for the new school. The December 31, 2001, unaudited conference financial reports indicate that \$95,094 in Cash and \$7,910 in Pledges needs to be fund raised now to begin construction this spring, according to North American Division policy. Construction will only begin after the Executive Committee has given financial approval according to policy.

An update confirming the land purchase will be given in the next Alberta Conference Newsletter. With that update it is hoped that donors who have been waiting for the final word will come forward to give a big financial push so that construction can begin this spring.


This new school building for our First Nations children is receiving excellent support, from both within and outside the conference. Maranatha International is still interested, as soon as construction dates can be supplied to them. And one-half of the 2002 NAD Sabbath School Investment Offering will come to this project.




From Women's Ministries . . .

IT'S OK TO HAVE NEEDS; IT'S NOT A SIGN OF WEAKNESS

"Blessed are the poor in spirit (the needy), for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." Matthew 5:4

nfortunately, in our society we establish a mentality that says, "If you're 'mature' (or in the case of the male ego, if you're 'tough'), then you won't have needs, or at least you won't admit to having them."

If you need comforting, there's something wrong with you.

If you need appreciation, you're insecure.

If you need support, you're weak.

If you need security, you lack faith.

If you need acceptance, you have a poor self-image.

But to admit that we have needs is not an admission of weakness, it's a confession of our humanity. We all have needs. . . . That's the way God made us. . . . and to admit that we have needs

is not only truthful, it's beneficial. We often succumb to a subtle but erroneous teaching that the more 'mature' we become in Christ, the fewer needs we have and the less we need each other.

Unaudited Year End Tithe and Offering Report

Praise God From Whom All Blessings Flow

od's blessings on the Alberta Conference membership are reflected in a 2001 Tithe increase of 8.22%. Total 2001 Tithe reported for the year ending December 31, 2001 amounted to \$7,317,819. The Alberta Advance offering increased by 6.18%, to \$251,635, and a large ADRA Annual Appeal increase of 42.5% resulted in an offering of \$163,250. However, Mission Offerings decreased by 2.06% to \$381,886.

These tithe and offering figures also demonstrate the faithfulness of each member of the Alberta Conference in giving their best to the Master to finish His mission in Alberta and the World. Conference Officers are grateful for the financial support that enables the pursuit of the Gospel Commission:

"Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world." Matthew 28:19 & 20

Amounts reported in this article are not yet audited. The process for auditing tithe and offerings includes the auditing of 2001 conference financial statements by the General Conference Auditing Service, the church's internal auditors, and then by Ernst & Young Chartered Accountants, the church's external auditors. The Ernst & Young Audited Financial Statements for 2001 will then be studied by the Alberta Conference Financial and Statistical Review Committee. Following the Financial and Statistical Review Committee, an annual Registered Charity Information Return and the Ernst & Young Audited Financial Statements are sent to the Charities Division of the Federal Government's Canada Customs and Revenue Agency.

Church members who have questions of a general financial nature may direct them to the Conference Treasurer; however, confidential donor information can never be disclosed. May God bless each one who sanctifies tithes and offerings for His use.


