Construction at Coralwood Commences

he building project at Coralwood Adventist Academy, Edmonton, got into full swing on April 1, 1996, as Master's Excavating demolished the forty-year-old section of the school in less than three hours. This \$700,000 project features a two-storey addition consisting of eight classrooms, and the renovation of the existing, "newer" portion of the school.

Mr. Bob Ramsay, Building Committee Chairperson, together with his committee, the constituency, and Jyoti Sharma, the architect, have been developing this project since February, 1994. According to Art Simus, Construction Manager, the first storey will be completed by early fall. Meanwhile, junior/senior high students have moved into other vacant areas of the school to carry on with their classes.



From the President . . .

f there is one subject that has piqued the imagination of Seventh-day Adventists over the years since their founding it is the subject of the second coming of Jesus. We are Adventists because we believe that He is coming back again! Our church was born with a sense of urgency that His coming was soon. And that sense of urgency increased with a growing understanding of Bible prophecy.



But time has gone by — much time. And some have begun to wonder if all that urgency is warranted. "After all," they say, "my father, and his father before him, thought they would never grow up to get married before Jesus returned...." Peter told the early church that in the last days scoffers would come saying "Where is this 'coming' he promised? Ever since our fathers died, everything goes on as it has since the beginning of creation." (2 Peter 3:4, N.I.V.) To join the class of scoffers it is not necessary to deny that He will return; by simply placing the event a long way off in the future we show the scepticism of our hearts.

Jesus saw the problem and when He outlined the signs of His coming in Matthew 24 He warned us, "So you also must be ready, because the Son of Man will come at an hour when you do not expect him." (Verse 44, N.I.V.) He then went on to illustrate with the story of a servant left in charge of others who decided his master wasn't returning very soon and began to settle in and enjoy a life quite different from that which was expected of him. Note that Jesus was not talking to strangers and unbelievers when He gave this warning; He was talking to His disciples. Even those expecting His return are apt to be surprised when it happens!

When God demonstrates His patience with His people, there seems to be a human tendency to question if He means what He says. God called the prophet Ezekiel during those turbulent and trying years immediately before the Babylonian captivity. As one studies the first half of the book of Ezekiel they see the increasing intensity of God's appeal to the people of Judah to recognize the coming captivity and prepare for it. But with an indifference that is strikingly up-to-date the people responded, "The vision he sees is for many years from now, and he prophesies about the distant future." (Ezekiel 12:27, N.I.V.) How quickly they learned how wrong they had been!

Do we really believe that Jesus is coming soon? One of the best ways for us to tell is to examine our priorities. Are we urgently looking for every opportunity to share with others His wonderful love? Or do we go about our business as though His coming is not a matter of urgency? Have we put all of the resources that we can into the proclamation of His gospel? Or does our use of our funds declare, "'My master is staying away a long time.""? (Matthew 24:48, N.I.V.) What do our priorities tell us about our commitment to His soon return?

Maranatha, my friends. Maranatha. Jesus is coming soon! Let us declare by word, by action, and by the use of our time and talents and funds that Jesus is coming soon. Even so come, Lord Jesus!

everal VISION 2000 evangelism objectives have been pursued since the beginning of this year. First, a vision of establishing an Adventist presence in unentered territories was developed by the conference Evange-

lism Committee. Over twenty areas in Alberta have been identified as potential sites for the spread of the Three

Angels' Messages within the next four years.

Secondly, the objective of training and equipping of lay ministers in soul winning has already born fruit with over 800 Bible studies started by as many as 100 youth in four different locations. Bruce Proud, a layman from College Heights, has been a source of inspiration, motivation, and organization as he worked tirelessly to

worked tirelessly to organize young people to do outreach for God. Sheila Turnacliff in Edmonton, Pastor Ron Nelson in Sylvan Lake, and Pastor John Adams in Calgary have all been instrumental in lighting the fire of witnessing in the hearts

of our youth. However, the greatest source of youth for outreach stemmed from Canadian Union College as dozens of young people have gladly lent their efforts to participate in witnessing and soul winning events in Alberta.

As a result of the pursuit of these two objectives, a model for church planting is beginning to sharpen in focus and is demonstrated in the two following examples:

CANMORE — On January 13, at least 18 young people under the direction of Pastors Steve Little and Kelly Schultz and the support of Bruce Proud organized what has come to be known as the "gospel detonation" campaign. Through this program, over 100 Bible study enrolments were secured in the Canmore area of Alberta while utilizing the help of youth. Followup of these contacts were made during the months of February and March. On April 7, CUC sponsored the Acronaires gymnist team to Canmore for a benefit program and on April 23 a Prophecy Seminar began with the intent of starting a new church fellowship in that area. A group of 13 interested individuals were activated on Sabbath morning of May 4 under the leadership of Kelly Schultz and Les Miller, Alberta's first GMA lay mission-

ary pastor. Les has continued the Prophecy Seminars and meetings in Canmore with a level of interest in baptism growing.

SOUTHEAST CALGARY — Pastor John Adams and the Bridgeland church were the key catalysts in starting new work in the southeastern part of Calgary where currently there is no church. By involv-

ing 10 CUC students in a short term, intensive, full-time ministry which included door to door colporteuring, street witnessing, literature distribution, telephone evangelism, and street preaching, a fellowship of about 20 newly activated interests was established after about three weeks. In fact, a series of Prophecy Seminar lectures was started in May and by Sabbath, May 25th, the fellowship was activated.

May God be praised for these early indications of the miracles yet to be wrought and may we continue to support and pray for our Conference leadership that has done so much to aid the realization of these initial attempts. Let us all continue to work and pray for "the night is coming when none can work."
